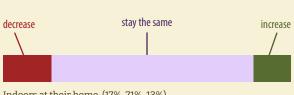
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### **Predicted Firewood Activities**

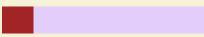
When asked how their firewood use may change over the next 3 years, 3/3 of respondents expect their firewood use to stay the same. Outdoor firewood use at home had the strongest prediction to increase (28% of respondents).

### What Would INCREASE or DECREASE Use?

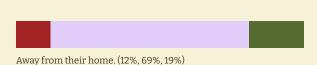
% = respondents that agreed "somewhat" to "very much" to factors that they thought would increase and decrease their firewood use in the next 3 years.



Indoors at their home. (17%, 71%, 13%)



Outdoors at their home (11% 61% 28%)



COVID-19 pandemic there was increased participation in outdoor activities and many found they enjoy fires.

Physical ability Spending more time to gather and use outdoors (75%) firewood (50%)

> Opportunity: consider offering additional services such as delivery and stacking.

Time to gather and Spending more time use firewood (33%) at home (61%)

## **Future Firewood Appliance Purchases**

% of respondents considering or planning on purchasing a firewood appliance in the next 3 years:

45% outdoor appliance such as a fireplace, chimnea, or fire pit.



19% indoor fireplace or inset

15% indoor firewood stove

12% wood pellet stove

12% outdoor furnace or boiler
